

EDITORIALLY SPEAKING



60TH ANNIVERSARY

This year marks the 60th anniversary of the incorporation of Baie d'Urfé as a Town.

It was in 1911 that 12 residents of the area - apparently almost the entire population - decided that the immediate and long-range interests of the area and its inhabitants would be best served if it were an organized community. These gentlemen, some permanent residents, some summer, petitioned Quebec to have this particular section of the then Parish of Ste. Anne du Bout de L,Ile (from which Ste. Anne de Bellevue and Senneville had also been carved) incorporated as a Town.

It must have been just about the smallest formal Town population-wise in Canada.

They called it Baie d'Urfé. Whence the name?

While the Town's original charter said Urfée and the Town was so called for years until the charter was amended, the name honors François-Saturnin Lascaris d'Urfé, a Sulpician missionary from France, who in 1686 established a mission on what is now Caron Point. At the time the Town was created, the little bay west of the Town Hall to Caron Point had been on maps for decades as Baie d'Urfé, and the railway stop had been called Baie d'Urfé since 1902, when at the request of historically-minded residents, it was changed from Bayview.

The 12 men who brought our lovely little community into being were: James Morgan, merchant, G. Edward Gudewill, manufacturer (whose son Jim is still a resident), Hon. J. Alderic Ouimet, former judge, Alfred Brunet, ex-banker, James Birchenough, real estate agent, St. George Dillon, merchant, David A. Poe, Engineer (whose son Alex is a resident), "all of the city and district of Montreal", Edward Maxwell, architect, William E. Davis, railway manager, Pascal Deslauriers, real estate agent, Olibrius Constantineau, manufacturer, and V. de Vivian Dowker, manufacturer, "the latter five, of the parish of Ste. Anne du Bout de L'Ile."

The charter provided that the Town would have a council comprising a mayor and six councillors, who would be elected for a term of two years.

The first election was set for July 1 (;) but no election was necessary -

Our first Council went in by acclamation, with Mr. Dowker as first Mayor. The present incumbent, Clark Graham, is the 14th.

Council's first meetings were held in a picturesque little green school-house just to the west of the Town Hall. Deemed both unsafe and an eyesore, it was razed in the '60's.

In 1912, Mr. Morgan, one of the Town's 12 "founders", gave the Town his distinctively designed summer home for use as the Town Hall and it has s served that role ever since.

Those were our formal beginnings.

Much the same charm and qualities which attracted people to this area 60 years ago continue to attract them today. Baie d'Urfé <u>is</u> a delightful area in which to live, and as we mark our 60th birthday, let us resolve to do our share to ensure that the same can be said another 60 years hence.

EDITORIAL COMMENT

Because of the volume of news and our limits as to space, we have made some minor changes in policy.

Library news has been divided, with news from the Adult Section one month and news from the Children's Section the following month. The same procedure has been endorsed to apply for Guide and Scout news. We regret the fact that this may occasionally present a difficulty and we appreciate the understanding and co-operation shown us by the groups involved. In the future we may be forced to expand on this policy.

Briefly we would like to mention some of the recent business conducted by our Council.

Civil Protection Certificates were presented to six of our Volunteer Firemen upon their successfully completing a course on Radiation Monitoring.

The decision has been reached to make a conditional Offer to Purchase Allan's Hill, the condition being that the purchase not be turned down by the taxpayers.

A number of residents on the Eastern area of Town have drawn up a petition protesting re-zoning to permit some multiple housing in their area. This followed a request by a landowner to have his land re-zoned for this purpose. His request however, has been turned down by the Council.

The next deadline for news will be August 25th. Your support and interest in our little paper has been very much appreciated. We hope you will join us in having a happy and relaxing summer and we hope as well, that you will participate fully in some of the many recreational activities provided in our community.

MAYOR'S REPORT



TOWN HALL

Upon your reading this, the report on the study for the amalgamation of West Island municipalities has been made public. The need for fusion has long been recognized, and the question has been studied informally over the past few years. About two years ago, Baie d'Urfé, Beaconsfield, Pte. Claire, Kirkland, Dollard des Ormeaux, Roxboro and Senneville decided to undertake a formal study. The rightness of the decision was supported by the passing of Bill 75 which created the Urban Community, in which it is required that by 1975 submissions to the Department of Municipal Affairs must be made for the realignment of municipal boundaries. The report recommends the fusion into one city of all West Island municipalities, with this to take place over a couple of years. The report has been discussed with Mr. Tessier, the Minister of Municipal Affairs, who has agreed that the proposal meets the requirements of existing law. All Councils will be studying the report in depth.

Council has been studying alternate approaches to snow removal and will be making cost and service comparisons when we have the required information.

It is believed by Council that the Town must make a decision relative to the acquisition of Allan's Hill. Should the Town decide in favour of this purchase, it is Council's intention to sell certain lots. The ultimate cost should be around \$5. per year per household for the purchase of this asset. Full information on all aspects of the proposal will be provided to you when it is available.

Preparations are proceeding for the celebration of the 60th Anniversary of the incorporation of our Town during Baie d'Urfé Days. We hope that the citizens will participate in the enjoyment of the program being planned.



To be effective, CHILD RESTRAINTS MUST BE ANCHORED TO THE FRAME OF THE CAR. The following is a description of restraints best suited to protect your child.



SAFETY SHIELD

The safety seat consists of a small chair placed on the car seat, preferably in the rear. It may or may not be padded or have an arm rest depending on style and price. An adjustable belt holds the child in the chair and the adult seat belt fits over the chair anchoring it to the car frame. The safety guard shown consists of a seat and molded shield protecting the child's body from the front. It is anchored to the frame by the adult belt. Seats and guards provide excellent protection for children from 12 months to 4 or 5 years. One disadvantage is that the child's movement is restricted and he may not want to stay in the restraint.



CHILD HARNESS

Harnesses are recommended for active children up to 5 years or 50 lbs. Of all the restraints, they allow the most freedom, letting the child sit, stand or lie down. It consists of shoulder and pelvic straps and is anchored to the car frame by a belt similar to a standard adult seat belt. When the child is big enough, about 50 lbs, he can use an adult seat belt. Put him on a hard cushion with the lap belt fastened snugly over the hips - not over the stomach where it could cause internal injuries in a collision.



INFANT CARRIER

Carriers are designed for infants up to about one year. The child is strapped into the carrier. It faces the seat back and is anchored to the car frame by the adult seat belt. A baby up to six months can also travel in a covered bassinet on the back seat. A fish net type covering should be wrapped around the bassinet so the child can't be thrown out. The bassinet is held in place by the back seat adult belt. Never hold an infant on your lap in the front seat where he could be crushed in a collision.



SAFE BICYCLING RULES

- * Avoid busy streets whenever you can. Expressway riding is definitely out!
- * Keep your bicycle under control no tricky steering, weaving or racing.
- * Stay on the right side of the street close to the curb. Move with traffic and watch for parked cars turning out or car doors opening suddenly.
- * Travel in single file when riding with others. Follow a full bike's length behind.
- * Steer with both hands on the handle grips except to signal when turning or stopping.
- * Ride alone and no big bundles. Another person or a large package on your bike can block your vision and throw you off balance.
- * Come to a dead stop at all stop signs, yield signs and red or amber lights.
- * Stop, look and listen before entering a street from a driveway or alley. Drivers may not see
- * Use your own power. Hitching on to moving vehicles is against the law and in case of a sudden stop or swerve, off the bike you'd go.
- * Do your riding in the daytime. If you must ride at night, wear something white and turn on your lights.
- * Be ready to put on the brakes at intersections. No pedal pumping as you approach.
- * Let people on foot and other vehicles go first when they are about to cross in front of you.






